A message from the production team

If nautical nonsense be something you wish... seek somewhere other than Stars and the Moon's production of 'The SpongeBob Inclusical'. What you are about to witness is far from nonsense, in fact it is a masterclass. A masterclass in optimism in the face of die-hard apathy.

SpongeBob's world is one of resounding pessimism and impending doomsound familiar? The denizens of the town refuse to accept his undying positivity. Whether he is applying to become manager of the Krusty Krab or preparing to climb 'Mount Humongous' (the deadly volcano threatening to erupt), his mantra is and always will be "I'M READY!"

This is Stars and the Moon's first production. Well it's our second. One point five, we like to call it. Last year we set about the massive task of creating a brand-new musical theatre company, not only that, but Melbourne's first all-abilities theatre company. We built a whole new model of theatre, one which could meet the needs of individuals across the spectrum of abilities. We designed a castmate system that could maximise the talents of our cast with and without disabilities. Were we sure it would work? No. Did we think anyone would put their hand up and join in? Maybe not. But join in they did, and almost immediately our castmate model began to weave a certain sort of magic. Just like the citizens of Bikini Bottom, we learned that with resilience, optimism, and a little bit of silliness, anything is possible.

Our castmate system (two actors covering one role) allows our actors with disabilities to support one another, maximally showcasing their talent and form long lasting genuine friendships over the course of the production. These individual connections have allowed the cast to become one big family and blur the lines of ability and disability. This model also empowers us to explore the complexity of each character and personify their unique traits according to the strengths of each castmate.

The mountains we climb are always of our own choosing. Stars and the Moon has faced many of its own 'Mt Humongouses'. We set out with a massive dream, to bridge the gap between community theatre and inclusive theatre. We rehearsed a show that was cancelled amidst the pandemic. We faced the difficult task of bringing a fully-fledged musical production to life, while also catering to the wide needs of our cast. It has always been the dedication, work ethic and gusto of our cast, crew and the wider Stars and the Moon community that has enabled us to push through (or as Sandy would put it, to 'Chop to the Top'!). We would like to extend our sincerest gratitude to the many humans who believed in our dream and helped us climb this mountain. To the cast for the countless hours of work and the endless joy they brought to the room, and to the production team,



Since then he has been in constant demand as a lighting designer for plays, musicals, dance and corporate events. Jason has most recently lit the highly acclaimed production World Premiere of ORACLE at the Victorian Arts Centre, Playhouse Theatre. He has designed the Australian Premiere Musicals of IN THE HEIGHTS, DREAMGIRLS, THE COLOUR PURPLE, MOTHERHOOD- THE

MUSICAL, Australian Premiere plays include BARASSI – THE STAGE SHOW, CITY SONG. National Touring productions he has designed include THE 39 STEPS, THEYRE PLAYING OUR SONG, AUSTRALIA DAY, ONE DAY OF THE YEAR, WHEN DAD MARRIED FURY, THE CLUB (Staring John Wood), JAMES AND THE GIANT PEACH, MANAGING CARMEN, HAIR – THE MUSICAL RIVIVAL, JUST THE TICKET, MATADOR – THE STAGE SHOW.

Jason's work has been seen throughout Australia, New Zealand, Singapore, Hong Kong, Manilla, London, New York and Tel Aviv. Jason was the Associate Lighting Designer on the recent International Tours of London's Westend and Broadway production of THE PLAY THAT GOES WRONG and the Westend production of the hit comedy PETER PAN GOES WRONG for Lunchbox Theatricals, London and International lighting designer on BUSTING OUT (11 Countries World Wide), BUBBLE SHOW FOR ADULTS (2022 Edinburgh Fringe Festival and Barons Court Westend Theatre, London), SHAOLIN WARRIORS (New Zealand, Singapore) and DALLAS THEATRE ACTORS (Texas, NY, Los Angeles).
